54. MAYOR'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

The Mayor welcomed the Waverley Apprentices to the Council meeting and invited them to introduce themselves to the Council and say a few words about how they had found their first few months in their various placements around the Council. The scheme was working very well and all apprentices were enjoying their jobs.

The Mayor reported that the Landrat had visited at the beginning of April and thanked everyone who had helped make the visit such a success. The Mayor commented that relationships and friendship with Mayen Koblenz continued to get stronger.

As the last Council meeting of this Council, the Mayor thanked the fifteen members of the Council who would not be standing for re-election, for their service on the Council and to the community in Waverley.

55. QUESTIONS FROM MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC

The following question was received from Mrs Ann Thurston of Farnham:-

"Is this Council concerned that Crest Nicholson is now controlled by Varde, the American hedge fund? Varde intends to restructure the company and to cut the amount of money that it borrows. Crest's main focus has always been on the building of large family homes and not small flats in market towns. Will this affect the future of the East Street Development?"

The Executive Portfolio Holder for East Street responded as follows:-

"Thank you for your question Mrs Thurston. You will be given a written response which I will read to you now. The short answer is no. I'm not concerned. Crest Nicholson like many other UK house builders over recent years have been forced to restructure as a consequence of the credit crunch and the slump in UK property values. This is a well-

documented legacy of tax and spend under the new Labour era and the very light bank regulations.

We are of course aware that Varde is in the process of taking effective control of Crest Nicholson. I see this as a positive move as Varde is in a position to restructure the Crest Nicholson business. Rather like the UK economy, Crest Nicholson has had too much debt. Varde is taking steps to re-gear Crest so the business is well placed to expand in what many house builders, particularly those in the South East, regard as an improving market. There are signs that the market is improving and Crest is seeing an upswing already in their business, focussed mainly in Southern England. Crest Nicholson has a track record of developing a wide range of sites and with planning permission for 239 homes and a significant planned investment in Farnham, we do not expect control by Varde to adversely affect the future of the East Street redevelopment.

I was indeed told today by Crest that they have spent in the region of £50,000 already progressing the detailed design work in relation to the Odeon cinema."
