46. QUESTIONS FROM MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC

The following questions were received in accordance with Procedure Rule 10:-

i. from Mrs Celia Sandars of Farnham:-

"In the context of the optimism expressed by the Portfolio Holder, in response to questions from the public at recent council meetings

regarding the East Street scheme, why has the council agreed, according to the development agreement published online on 30 January, that the developer should be allowed up to six and a half years to complete the development, rather than the two and a half years, previously agreed?"

The Executive Portfolio Holder for East Street replied as follows:-

"Thank you again Mrs Sandars. I know that you like simple clear responses so in response I can state that you are wholly incorrect in your reading and interpretation of the Development Agreement. I will elaborate further: I assume that your question refers to paragraph 11.2.5 in the 2002 Development Agreement that was varied in 2009.

The Council agreed some years ago that the regeneration scheme would be a single phase development and therefore the construction period would be greatly reduced.

Under the Development Agreement, the Developer is to follow an agreed programme for construction and is obliged to construct most elements of the scheme within two and a half years and all parts within three years. In actual fact, the most recent programme estimates the build time as being in the region of 1 year and 10 months from start on site with a further period of months to fit out the new homes.

The agreement (specifically Clause 20.1.5) provides that the Council can terminate if the Developer is in default of its obligations including if the works are more than 6 months behind programme and there is no prospect of acceleration. As is usually the case, the programme might be subject to extension (for example if the building works burnt down or a similar force majeure event occurred) and the contract was extended in 2009 to add in a hard long stop date (i.e. a date subject to no possible extension whatsoever) after which the Council can terminate.

I trust that armed with this knowledge you will seek to correct any misconceived views."

ii. from David Wylde of Farnham:-

"How can the covenant for Brightwells Gardens be considered appropriate, when the development would be built on part of the land the covenant purports to protect from development?"

The Executive Portfolio Holder for East Street replied as follows:-

"The Council intends to retain the name 'Brightwell Gardens' for the public open space created by the development, and the land on which the Bowling Club was formerly situated will also be maintained as public open space under the terms of the Deed of Covenant contained within the Development Agreement with CNS.

The open garden space created by the proposed development scheme will actually be much larger than the existing Brightwells Gardens, with an increase from 0.25 hectares to 0.321 hectares in total – an increase of 28.4%. The increased area of gardens will retain its essential character as public open space and must be cultivated and maintained as such for generations to come."
