46. QUESTIONS FROM MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC

The following questions were received in accordance with Procedure Rule 10:-

i. from Mrs Celia Sandars of Farnham

"Following the front-page article in the Farnham herald of 25 January asserting that the proposed replacement Gostrey Centre in the Brightwells Scheme will be severely disadvantaged by facilities allowed to the adjacent M&S Simply Food Store via consent to planning application NMA/2012/0025, would the Leader or Portfolio Holder please tell me exactly and in detail what is proposed to overcome the major difficulties for the future Gostrey Centre? For instance, will a new agreement be negotiated with M&S to restore the original access, will there be other variations to the current plans which might enable the Gostrey to function as it should, or will the Centre be re-located away from the development site, as it is rumoured?"

Celia Sandars was unable to attend the meeting to ask her question in person and the Mayor confirmed that a written response would be sent, the details of which are set out below:-

"Waverley is in regular discussions with the trustees of the Brightwells Gostrey Centre. We are committed to deliver an improved building and facilities for the residents of Farnham and the surrounding area.

We are actively working with the trustees and the manager of the centre to find the best way forward and are discussing a range of options that will ensure that the centre can thrive and continue to offer support to the community of Farnham.

The Portfolio Holder for East Street met with the Chairman of the Trustees on Monday 18 February 2013 at the Gostrey Centre, together with a senior representative from Crest Nicholson. You will need to ask him, but he left the meeting last night feeling that the Chairman was content with the outcome of our discussions. We really want to deliver top-notch purpose-built facilities for use by users of the Gostrey Centre."

ii. from Town Councillor David Attfield of Farnham:

"Given that Waverley Borough Council's Corporate Plan pledges to work with parish councils, voluntary groups and the community to meet the needs of residents, why has the Waverley Borough Council introduced changes to car park license fees without consulting with those affected, and does the Council appreciate that the increase proposed will kill the farmers' market in Farnham?"

Mr Attfield was also unable to attend the meeting and the written response to his question is as follows:-

"Thank you for your question Mr Attfield. You are correct. Waverley aims to work with parish councils, voluntary groups and the community to meet the needs of residents. However, it also has a duty to look after the financial interests of all of Waverley's residents. Sometimes a balance has to be struck between the competing objectives.

Over the last year we have been conducting a review of the licence fees we charge in the Council's car parks to ensure that council taxpayers get an appropriate return from their landholdings. We have been working hard to achieve a balance between the objectives I have mentioned. In Farnham's Central car park, we have collected just £1 rent per year for many years from the Town Council who promote the farmers market. To continue this is not fair to the rest of Waverley's taxpayers and the modest sum of £50 per annum and, £10 per stall per market, strikes the right balance for all parties. These prices are exactly the same as those which will be charged in Godalming to the South West Surrey Farmers Market in Crown Court."

iii. from Town Councillor David Beaman of Farnham

"Why has WBC decided not to distribute all of the grant that it received from Central Government in Local Parish Council Tax Allocation Grant?"

The Portfolio Holder for Finance gave the following response:-

"The Government decided to include a notional amount within Waverley's government grant for 2013/14 towards town and parish council tax support. This grant relates to the changes in the arrangements for the payment of Council Tax Benefit and the additional costs and risks passed to the precepting authorities, but the grant only covers 90% of the cost. Although Government ministers have confirmed to us that there is no requirement to pay council tax support to Town and Parish Councils, Waverley is keen to ensure that the Borough, Town and Parish Council taxpayers are all treated fairly.

Waverley is proposing to share the grant with the Town and Parish Councils and, in a similar way, the additional costs, including the additional risks and the cost of the hardship fund are proposed to be borne proportionally and so the net amount of grant available for distribution is reduced.

As explained to the Towns and Parishes at our meeting on 15th January this year, the amount of take-up is uncertain and we will review the risk reserve later in the year.

As well as the direct payment of £80,615 grant to Towns and Parishes, Waverley has introduced a Local Council Tax Support scheme in January this year, and modified its scheme for council tax exemptions in December 2012, both of which will benefit Towns and Parishes by reducing the Government grant shortfall.

In the meantime, Waverley will continue to absorb the risks on council tax collection and continue to pay precepts to Town and Parishes in advance of council tax being paid by council tax payers."

47. MAYOR'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

The Mayor informed the Council that Councillor Christopher Storey was making a good recovery and he hoped to be able to return to the Council soon. He also drew councillors' attention to the Olympic Statue which had now been placed in the cabinet at the entrance to the Chamber for all to see.

The Mayor had recently received a visit from the High Sheriff of Surrey and had spent 2 hours showing her around the Borough. The tour included the Devils Jumps, a talk by Nick Baxter, a member of the Countryside team, about the amount of countryside land Waverley looks after, as well as a visit to a food bank and Skillway.

The Mayor finally congratulated the Waverley Pancake Team who had beaten Guildford Borough Council at the annual pancake race along Guildford High Street and were now in possession of a trophy.
