POTENTIAL HAZARDS:

Falls into water, slipping, Weils disease. Drowning (Low risk)

CURRENT RISK ASSESSED AS:

The risk of injury is low to medium

SUMMARY OF BEST PRACTICE:

Construction Phase:

The appointed contractors to sign Waverley's Safety Rules for Contractors and provide risk assessment

Warning Signs to be erected.

Temporary Fencing to be erected when contractors are not on site.

Site Vehicles not to exceed 5mph.

General

Specific water risk assessment to be carried out for each new pond.

Ponds will be fenced to prevent disturbance. Gated access will be provided for monitoring and educational use. Gates will be locked when not in use.

Pond sides to be shallow in accordance with Pond Conservation Trust Guidelines (1:10 gradient).

Maximum depth of ponds to be 0.75 meters.

Maximum size will be approximately 150 Sq meters.

Pond dipping platform to be covered by anti-slip surface and be constructed slightly above water level.

Use of educational pond;

Pond dipping activities for organised visits only, and only under ranger supervision.

All Countryside staff to be checked with CRB.

Follow guidelines on outside education.

Site to be checked immediately prior to visit to ensure no apparent hazards.

Pre-visit briefing with school should identify each parties responsibilities during visit,

Teachers are responsible for children's' general welfare and discipline.

Ensure required number of adults to ensure adequate supervision.

Staff are available to facilitate leaning during field trip.

Mobile phone should be available.

First aider should be on site.

Provide Hand washing facilities.

Staff to brief groups on activities, noting safe behaviour, contact with water if cuts present on hands, potentially dangerous actions and limits of activities

First aid kit to be available at all times.

Keep children closely supervised in small groups with 1 adult to five children minimum
