DRAFT COST MODELS FOR THE PROVISION OF A 'BOLT ON' FOOD WASTE COLLECTION SERVICE

Detailed below are indicative costs for the provision of a food waste collection service in Waverley based on three different scenarios, the third of which is for a single urban round (the model being proposed in the report).

None of these projections take account of the Surrey County Council Offer, which totals £380,000 capital, and three years of revenue at £150,000 per annum (to be renegotiated thereafter). These would be applied pro-rata depending on the option pursued.
