Application for a new Premises Licence at the Co-Op, 47-51 Farnborough Road, Farnham, Surrey

I write further to our telephone conversation of this morning.

We currently have issues in the area of where the premises licence is being applied for. These include issues regarding under age sales and thefts of alcohol at other premises in the area and seizure of alcohol from youngsters in the street. It also includes anti social behaviour.

We would therefore like the following conditions incorporated into the operating schedule:

- A comprehensive digital colour CCTV system will be installed at the premises. The system will be maintained and operational at all times the premises are open for business. Video recordings shall be available for a minimum of 31 days and shall be made available to an authorised officer or police officer together with facilities for viewing. There will be a capability to download to CD/DVD.
- Staff shall be trained in the basic law relating to the sale/supply of alcohol and written records will be kept for inspection. This will include the law relating to both the sale and the consumption of alcohol to persons under 18 and the refusal of sale of alcohol to persons who are drunk. There will be an ongoing training regime with refresher/reinforcement training at intervals of no more than six months.
- The premises will operate a Challenge 25 policy and will only accept passport, photo driving licence or ID cards bearing the PASS hologram as forms of identification.
- An under age refusal book will be maintained and will be available for inspection by an authorised officer.
- Notices will be prominently displayed at point of sale detailing the restrictions on sales to children.
- An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the Borough Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - All crimes reported to the venue
 - All ejections of patrons
 - Any incidents of disorder
 - Any faults in the CCTV system
 - Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
