We have already sent a letter to you reference this application but wish to add further comments regarding the extra traffic and the parking. Previously Bennetts closed at 5.30pm so the 10 parking spaces outside the store were able to be used by diners at the Gulshan restaurant and customers of the launderette in the evening, this will not be possible with the Co-op store as they will be open in the evenings as well probably until 11pm like most of their other stores, and if they are also selling alcohol this will generate more traffic and will 10 parking spaces be enough? We already have cars from residents of the flats above the shops and residents of the Farnborough road with no parking of their own parking here, often with two wheels on the pavement due to there being cars parked on both sides of the road, so this will only exaggerate the situation. Also the extra noise etc from delivery lorries needs to be taken into consideration as the larger the variety of items sold the more stock will be needed so there will be more or larger lorries, the small grass covered roundabout outside our house is very difficult for the lorries to turn round resulting in them usually driving over it several times as they go backwards and forwards trying to avoid the parked cars.
