Annexe 1 – Mandatory Conditions

Alcohol

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:

- At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
- At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

- 1. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children:-
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to:-
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on:-
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that:-
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:-
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

ELEMENTS OF OPERATING SCHEDULE TO ADDRESS LICENSING OBJECTIVES:

a) General - all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e)

The premises shall maintain the standard practices listed below at all times.

All reasonable steps shall be taken to ensure that the premises shall have a positive impact upon the local environment and its residents at all times.

The premises shall be fitted with an alarm system.

A comprehensive digital colour CCTV system shall be installed at the premises.

The CCTV system shall enable frontal head and shoulders image of every person entering the premises.

The CCTV system shall be maintained and operational at all times the premises are open for business.

Video recordings shall be available for a minimum of 31 days and shall be made available to an authorised officer or police officer together with facilities for viewing (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998).

There shall be a capability to download to CD/DVD.

Staff shall be trained in the basic law relating to the sale/supply of alcohol and written records will be kept for inspection. This training shall include the law relating to both the sale and the consumption of alcohol to persons under18 and the refusal of sale of alcohol to persons who are drunk.

There shall be an ongoing training regime.

The premises shall operate a "Challenge 21" policy and shall only accept passport, photo driving licence or ID cards bearing the PASS hologram as forms of identification.

An under age refusal book shall be maintained and shall be available for inspection by an authorised officer.

Notices shall be prominently displayed at point of sale detailing the restrictions on sales to children.

Spirits shall be located behind the counter.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police.

The CCTV system shall enable a frontal head and shoulders image of every person entering the premises.

The CCTV system shall record in real time and operate whilst the premises are open for licensable activities.

The CCTV recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days.

CCTV recordings shall be made available to an authorised officer or a Police Officer (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24 hours of any request.

The premises shall adopt the "Challenge 21" national proof of age standards scheme.

c) Public Safety

There shall be appropriate fire safety procedures in place, along with appliances, including fire extinguishers (foam, H_2O , CO_2), fire blankets, internally illuminated fire exit signs, a smoke detector and emergency lighting.

All fire safety appliances shall be checked annually and shall comply with the relevant British Standards.

All fire escapes/escape routes shall be clearly marked and kept free from obstructions at all times.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Clear and legible notices shall be displayed to remind customers to leave the premises quietly. A trade waste agreement shall be maintained at all times.

e) The protection of children from harm

To protect children from harm, the premises shall be effectively and responsibly managed.

There shall be a sufficient number of people employed or engaged to provide suitable staffing levels.

There shall be appropriate instruction, training and supervision of all staff employed or engaged on the premises.

The licensee and staff shall ask persons who appear to under the age of 21 for photographic ID, such as proof of age cards, the Connexions card and Citizen card, photographic driving licence or passport, an official card issued by HM Forces or by an EU country, bearing the photograph and date of birth of the bearer.

A register shall be kept and maintained on the premises showing all refused sales, etc.
