<u>LICENSING ACT 2003 - APPLICATION FOR A NEW PREMISES LICENCE – , THE VILLAGERS, WOODSIDE ROAD , CHIDDINGFOLD, SURREY, GU8 4QD.</u>

[Wards Affected: Chiddingfold & Dunsfold Ward]

Summary and Purpose

1. The purpose of the report is to enable the Sub-Committee to consider an application from Chiddingfold Ex-Servicemens Club Committee, for a new premises licence for The Villagers, Woodside Road, Chiddingfold, Surrey GU8 4QD, where one valid representation has been received.

Background

- 2. An application, attached at <u>Annexe 1</u>, has been received for a new premises licence from Chiddingfold Ex-Servicemen's Club Committee, for a new detached single storey purpose built building located within a residential area. The Premises comprise of an entrance lobby, lounge area (can be divided into two rooms), Kitchen, toilets, utility room, 2 store rooms and an office. There is a patio area to the side of the premises, a car park immediately in front with a perimeter fence surrounding the premises. A floor plan is attached at <u>Annexe 2</u>.
- 3. A previous larger premises, Chiddingfold Ex-Serviceman's Club that operated under a Club Premises Certificate (which is still live) has been mostly demolished with the new premises and a number of surrounding houses having been built on the land previously occupied. The previous club certificate is attached at Annexe 3.
- 4. The application proposes that the licence will allow the premises to sell alcohol for consumption both on and off the premises, regulated entertainment and late night refreshment. The application is for a full Premises Licence rather than a Club Premises Certificate. An accompanying letter to the application states that the Club Committee intend to continue to use the premises as a club, and subject to club rules but will also make the facilities available to non-members, hence the application for a Premises Licence. A copy of the letter is attached at Annexe 4.

Activities Sought under this Licence Application

5. The applicant seeks to license the premises as shown below. Attached to this document at Annexe 5 are some amendments to the application following discussions between the applicant and Surrey Police. Also attached at Annexe 6 is a plan showing the area of the premises and surrounding properties.

What the Sub-Committee may do

8. Reasons must be given by the Sub-Committee for any decision made, since there is an opportunity for any applicant or any

objector to appeal to the Magistrates' Court against the Licensing Sub-Committee decision. The Sub-Committee may:

- Grant the application as submitted; or
- Refuse the application; or
- Reduce or refuse parts of the application submitted,
- Add conditions to promote the Licensing Objectives, if the Sub-Committee considers it appropriate and proportionate in the light of the representations received.

Recommendation

 - To refuse to specify a person as the designated premises supervisor;
 - To reject the application.
