LICENSING ACT 2003 - APPLICATION FOR A NEW PREMISES LICENCE – MARKS & SPENCER, LION LANE, HASLEMERE, SURREY GU27 1LD. [Wards Affected: Haslemere Critchmere & Shottermill]

Summary and Purpose

1. The purpose of the report is to enable the Sub-Committee to consider an application from Marks & Spencer Foods Limited for a new premises licence for Marks & Spencer (M&S), Lion Lane, Haslemere, Surrey GU27 1LD, where two representations have been received from 'other persons'.

Background

2. An application has been received for a new premises licence for this ground floor retail store with food hall and customer café. The premises has an existing premises licence which was transferred to M&S from the previous occupants of the building, Co-Operative Group. M&S have stated on the application that on the grant of the new premises licence, the existing one will be surrendered. A copy of the existing premises licence is attached at Annexe 1.

Activities Sought under this Licence Application

3. The applicant seeks approval of the refurbishment of the premises and to license the premises as shown below. An extract of the relevant pages from the application form is attached at <u>Annexe 2</u>. Also attached to this document at <u>Annexe 3</u> is a plan showing the area of the premises and surrounding properties. In brief summary, the applicant seeks the following activities in the new licence, if granted. Please see application for activities in full.

Sale of Alcohol:

0600 to 0000 Monday to Sunday (Box J)

(Existing 0600 to 2300 Monday to Saturday &1000 to 2230 Sunday)

Opening hours:

0600 to 0000 Monday to Sunday (Box L)

(Existing 0600 to 2300 Monday to Saturday &1000 to 2230 Sunday)

Box M to address the four licensing objectives is also reproduced.

Licensing Objectives

- 4. The four Licensing Objectives of the Licensing Act 2003 are set out below. Any representations for consideration must relate to one or more of these objectives, and representations must be from the responsible authorities under this legislation and/or any other persons.
 - 1. the prevention of crime and disorder
 - 2. public safety

- 3. the prevention of public nuisance
- 4. the protection of children from harm

Annexe 1 – Mandatory Conditions

Alcohol

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:

- At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
- At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal • licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

- **1.** (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- **3.** (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- **4.** The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: $\frac{1}{2}$ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."
- **5**. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

- 6. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 5—
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979(a);
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—

 $P = D + (D \times V)$

where---

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994(b).
- 7. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 6 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 6 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

ELEMENTS OF OPERATING SCHEDULE TO ADDRESS LICENSING OBJECTIVES:

a) General - all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e)

A CCTV monitoring system shall be installed and maintained.

The CCTV images shall be recorded and retained for at least 21 days and shall be handed to the Police/Local Authority upon request.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Signage shall be displayed in store stating that it is an offence for people aged under 18 to purchase alcohol.

The premises shall be fitted with a panic button for staff to press in the cases of emergency. The premises shall be fitted with a burglar alarm.

c) Public Safety

The premises shall meet the requirements of the Fire Safety Order 2005.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

No deliveries shall take place between the hours of 23:00 and 06:00 the following day.

e) The protection of children from harm

All staff shall be trained in relation to underage related sales of alcohol and a proof of age scheme shall be in place.

A "Challenge 25" policy shall be in place and notices shall be prominently displayed within the store.

An electronic till prompt shall be in operation when alcohol is scanned to remind staff to check the age of the purchaser.


An "Age Refusals Register" refusals book shall be kept to record where sales of alcohol are challenged or refused.

Annexe 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the Licensing Authority after agreement with Surrey Police

- 1. A comprehensive digital colour CCTV system shall be installed at the premises. The system shall be maintained and operational at all times the premises are open for business. Video recordings shall be available for a minimum of 21 days and shall be made available to an authorised officer or police officer together with facilities for viewing. There shall be a capability to download to CD/DVD.
- 2. Staff shall be trained in the law relating to the sale/supply of alcohol and written records will be kept for inspection. This shall include the law relating to both the sale and the consumption of alcohol to persons under 18 and the refusal of sale of alcohol to persons who are drunk. There shall be an ongoing training regime with refresher/reinforcement training at intervals of no more than six months.
- 3. The premises shall operate an age verification scheme such as "Challenge 25" policy and shall only accept passport, photo driving licence or ID cards bearing the PASS hologram as forms of identification.
- 4. A refusal book or equivalent electronic equipment shall be maintained and shall be available for inspection by an authorised officer.
- 5. Notices shall be prominently displayed at point of sale displaying the age verification policy.



To whom it may concern

Given that the deadline for comment is midnight tonight, I realise my email is quite late. However, I honestly did not see the notice where it was placed on the occasions I've walked to the Post Office.

I would like to say that I have reservations about the option the M&S new store may be given to open from 6am until midnight, under this application. My belief is that opening until 10pm latest is sufficient Mon-Sat and until 4pm on Sunday. Their application should be restricted to this, with perhaps the possibility of extended hours for a fixed number of days per year. I appreciate they may want to capitilise on Christmas or Easter trading.

From experience and by comparison to living in several other areas, it is clear there is a constant anti social element that gathers on Lion Green and Weyhill. It is stating the obvious to say there is minimal police presence in Haslemere, now with no police station, and this will only get worse given Mr. Osborne's further intended cuts to policing. If this store is given the choice to open until midnight, it gives further excuse to 'hang around' even later on Lion Green, the result of which is further disruption in the area. I would also question the requirement of the hours kept by ' he kebab van' but that's another issue entirely.

Having also had the time to further read the application, I would also like to comment on the request for M&S store to have a Sunday delivery option. Why would a company of M&S's size be unable to arrange their logistics for Monday to Saturday delivery. There is no need for this whatsoever. We already have an overload of lorry deliveries Monday to Saturday, with builders merchants, school caterers and gardeners constantly in motion - around what is accepted as a very high density residential area. I believe given the current absence of larger vehicles on a Sunday, introduction would be detrimental to child safety. It is a given that Lion Green is one of the main play areas and I believe Sunday is the one day when we can all relax a bit as regards traffic. Sunday is also the day that a number of cycle and fitness clubs gather exactly because there is less traffic in the vicinity. Introduction of large vehicles entering Lion Green on a Sunday when there is no need if M&S organises themselves properly, will be a safety hazard. We have already had one death at Lion Green in the last couple of weeks and any action possible should be taken to prevent further incidents.

I am neither against commerce or convenience, but feel we are already provided for by the supermarket which currently opens long hours and contributes to a large amount of traffic at the junction of Lion Lane and Weyhill. There is no requirement to further add to this and a balance needs to be achieved for the benefit of everyone and not just commerce. M&S are welcome to trade but not at cost to residents.
