Summary and Purpose

1. The purpose of this report is to enable the Sub-Committee to consider an application for a variation to the Premises Licence of The William Cobbett, 4 Bridge Square, Farnham, Surrey, GU9 7QR, from Ms Jessica Rolfe, the current Premises Licence Holder. The application has received 2 representations from 'other persons'.

Background

- 2. The premises was the subject of conversion and variation in the transitional period, under the 2003 Licensing Act. Accordingly, The William Cobbett, Farnham was granted a Premises Licence.
- 3. A copy of the latest Premises Licence is attached at <u>Annexe 1</u> and summarised below:
 - Regulated Entertainment (Films, Indoor Sports Events, Regulated anything similar and Facilities for Dancing)

Sunday to Wednesday 1000 to 0000 Thursday 1000 to 0030 Friday & Saturday 1000 to 0100

• Regulated Entertainment (Live Music)

Sunday to Wednesday 1000 to 2330 Thursday to Saturday 1000 to 0000

Regulated Entertainment (Recorded Music)

Monday to Sunday 1100 to 0000

Late Night refreshment

Sunday to Wednesday 2300 to 0000 Thursday 2300 to 0030 Friday & Saturday 2300 to 0100

Sale of Alcohol (both on and off the premises)

Sunday to Wednesday 1000 to 2330 Thursday 1000 to 0000 Friday & Saturday 1100 to 0030

Opening hours

Opening hours as for the sale of alcohol, closing 30 minutes after the sale of alcohol ceases.

Activities Sought under this Licence Application

4. In brief summary, the applicant seeks to extend the licensable hours for sale of alcohol on a Friday and Saturday night only, by an extra 30 minutes to 0100 hours.

Note: The opening times of the premises are linked to the sale of alcohol, closing 30 minutes after the sale of alcohol ceases.

All other licensable activities, times and days to remain the same.

The applicant also requests that the following condition (under Public Safety) be removed:

At least one member of staff shall obtain SIA doorstaff qualifications as well as their personal licence and shall be on duty whenever live music, DJ music and/or dancing are provided to the general public.

And replaced with:

Door staff with licensed SIA qualification will be on duty during live music.

Officers would suggest that if the Committee were minded to grant the change to the door staff condition, the new condition be amended to read as follows;

SIA Licensed door staff must be on duty at the premises during performances of live music.

A copy of the application form is attached at Annexe 2.

5. Attached at <u>Annexe 3</u> is a plan showing the area of the premises and surrounding properties.

Licensing Objectives

- 6. The four Licensing Objectives of the Licensing Act 2003 are set out below. Any representations for consideration must relate to one or more of these objectives, and representations must be from the responsible authorities under this legislation and/or other persons.
 - Prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - 2. Public Safety
 - 3. Prevention of Public Nuisance
 - 4. Protection of Children from Harm

Representations received

Responsible Authorities

7. There have been no representations from any of the Responsible Authorities.

Other Persons

8. There have been 2 representations from 'Other Persons', which are reproduced at Annexe 4.

Human Rights

9. Under Article 8, European Convention on Human Rights, everyone has the right to respect for his private and family life, his home and his correspondence. There shall be no interference by a public authority with the exercise of this right except such as is in accordance with the law and is necessary in a democratic society in the interests of national security, public safety or the economic well-being of the country, for the prevention of disorder or crime, for the protection of health or morals, or for the protection of the rights and freedoms of others. In Licensing Act 2003 cases this means that the Sub-Committee must have regard to the effect of its decisions on local residents, and balance their interests against those of the public at large (e.g. the customers of the premises under consideration) and the people operating the business from the premises.

Annexe 1 – Mandatory Conditions

Films

The admission of children under the age of 18 to film exhibitions permitted under the terms of this licence shall be restricted in accordance with any recommendations made

- a. By the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC) where the film has been classified by that Board, or
- b. By the Licensing Authority where no classification certificate has been granted by the BBFC, or, where the licensing authority has notified the licence holder that section 20 (3) of the Licensing Act 2003 applies to the film.

Alcohol

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:

- At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
- At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

- 1. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children:-
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to:-
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act):
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on:-
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that:-
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:-
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.


