a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e) (please read guidance note 11)

The information provided in this box is solely for information purposes only and not intended to be converted into conditions on the licence.

This application seeks to extend the trading hours at the premises by one additional hour on Thursday to Saturdays, amend non-standard timings for notable days as detailed in the application and update the conditions on the premises licence in accordance with detailed pre consultation which has taken place with the responsible authorities.

We have considered the impact of the proposed variation and have carefully considered the steps to be taken to ensure that the application and proposed operation will continue to promote the licensing objectives.

In particular we have undertaken consultation with the Police Licensing Officer and Environmental Health Officer prior to issuing the application and their comments have been taken into account in respect of the new set of proposed conditions.

The purpose for seeking the extension of one additional hour the terminal hour for licensable activities and opening hours on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays is to allow customers to stay in a well-managed, controlled and supervised premises for longer on these days, if they wish, and the applicant believes that the later hours will allow a longer wind down period and a more gradual dispersal of customers from the premises, which can be managed and contained, reducing impact on the area and licensing objectives by a mass dispersal at any one time.

A thorough set of conditions is offered as part of the application, including door staff and ID Scan, to ensure that the premises licence is suitable for the style of operation in the event that later hours are granted.

Stonegate are a well experienced licensed operator and have in place an extensive licensing manual containing policies and procedures across the whole estate, which are adapted at site level to ensure the premises operates to a high standard and promotes the Licensing Objectives. These include policies regarding social responsibility, training, underage sales and challenge policies, incident logs, queuing policy, drugs and dispersal policy, and noise management and the management of outside areas policies as well as procedures to prevent crime and disorder and public nuisance. These robust policies and procedures that already in place will continue to operate if the extended hours are granted.

Considering the above, we believe that the variation will not undermine the Licensing Objectives. The Applicant believes that the existing measures within the operating schedule, alongside the existing robust policies in place, the new proposed conditions and experience of the applicant, will ensure the premises continue to promote the Licensing Objectives if the application is granted.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Please see box a) above. In addition, the following new conditions are proposed in the event that the application sought is granted:-

 Appropriate digital CCTV equipment and a sufficient number of cameras shall be installed and maintained at the premises to record colour images that are clear enough to allow the Police to use them to investigate any crimes that are committed on the premises. The areas covered by the cameras will cover all areas and corridors within the premises that are open to the public

- 2. A camera will be positioned to obtain images of persons entering the building by the main entrance
- 3. The CCTV system will be in operation and recording at all times the premises is open for licensable activities.
- 4. Recordings made on the CCTV system shall be retained for a period of at least 30 days of recording
- 5. A minimum of 2 notices stating that CCTV is in operation shall be displayed throughout the premises where members and guests have access.
- 6. All training shall be recorded and then signed by the person completing the training. The DPS or a personal licence holder who is employed at the premises must also countersign the training record.
- 7. The premises shall maintain written policies regarding the following: Dispersal, Drugs, Searching and Conflict Management. These policies shall be made available to an authorised officer of the police or local authority on request.
- 8. The premises shall install and maintain an ID scanner at the premises. The ID scanner will be in use on Fridays and Saturdays from 20:00 hours when the premises is open for the sale of alcohol beyond 01:00 hours. At all other times the use of the ID scanner will be subject to risk assessment. If the system is broken, the Licence Holder, DPS or a member of staff are to contact the Police Licensing Team immediately and the fault rectified as soon as practicable.
- 9. On Fridays when the premises is open for the sale of alcohol beyond 01:00 hours, there shall be 2 SIA registered door staff working at the premises from 20:00 hours, rising to 4 SIA registered door staff from 21:00 hours, until 30 minutes after closing time to effect the dispersal policy.
- 10. On Saturdays when the premises is open for the sale of alcohol beyond 01:00 hours, there shall be 2 SIA registered door staff working at the premises from 20:00 hours, rising to 5 SIA registered door staff from 21:00 hours, until 30 minutes after closing time to effect the dispersal policy.
- 11. An incident log shall be kept on the premises and all incidents shall be recorded with time day and date and a summary of the incident.
- 12. Frequent inspections of toilet areas within the premises shall be undertaken for the purpose of reducing the risk of drug and substance abuse and criminal offences on every occasion when public entertainment is being provided at the premises under the terms of the licence
- 13. The management shall ensure that no drinks or bottles or glasses shall be permitted in the front external smoking area after 20:00 hours on Fridays and Saturdays.
- 14. Alcoholic and other drinks may not be removed from the premises in open containers save for consumption in any external area for that purpose.

- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
- 4. Where taking place in a building or other structure please tick as appropriate. Indoors may include a tent.

- 13. An applicant's agent (for example solicitor) may sign the form on their behalf provided that they have actual authority to do so.
- 14. Where there is more than one applicant, both applicants or their respective agents must sign the application form.
