I would like to make comments in support of the application for the new premises licence at the Holloway Hill Sports Pavilion.

As local residents (we live on [REDACTED] very close to the recreation ground), my family and I are very much in favour of increased opening hours and the opportunity to make greater use of the bar at the sports association. It is very valuable to have a place to meet friends close to our home, and especially lovely for it to be next to a safe, open, green space where our children can meet their friends and play. The recreation ground has sometimes felt a little unsafe in the evenings, as a quiet park, with minimal lighting and no one around. Having a proper venue open there, where people can gather in a safe environment, can only increase the safety of the area and make it a place where people enjoy spending time, without having to leave Busbridge. Without an establishment like the Pavilion open in the evenings, the recreation ground could easily be a popular spot for antisocial behaviour, whereas the Pavilion has the potential to turn the area into a local social hub, which could be a huge asset for Busbridge residents.

In summary, we are very supportive of the venture and very much hope that the application will be granted.

I am writing to support the application for a new Premises Licence at the Holloway Hill Sports Pavilion, Busbridge Lane, Godalming, GU7 1PU.

We have been residents in [REDACTED] for 11 years and have long been amazed at the lack of facilities in Busbridge. I am aware there may be archaic reasons for this but I fully support a modernisation of the approach to licensing, especially given that it involves a community sports centre which is the heart of the local community.

The Howling Owl company should be congratulated and supported as well. They pro-actively set up the pop-up coffee shop at the rec during lockdown which was a huge success. Since, they have taken over the running of the bar from the cricket club and we use this quite regularly. However, I believe 2 things are holding things back:

1. Current licensing restrictions limit the times that the bar is open and their ability to publicise those times – this makes it difficult for local residents to know when to visit (we have been on a number of times to find the bar closed)
2. There is no ability/incentive for Howling Owl to upgrade the facilities. Whilst the current bar is functional, it desperately needs updating and upgrading.

A new Premises Licence for the bar will solve both problems and I am sure that, if awarded, would give Busbridge a new heart to the community.

The premises are not close to local housing and I have no concerns over noise etc.

I therefore fully support the application.

We would like to express our wholehearted support for the above licensing application being made by those running the clubhouse as part of Godalming Cricket Club, Howling Owl and the HHSAA.

I have been a player at the Cricket Club for 16 years and the grounds have become an avenue of sport, cultural benefit and safe and community-driven socialising for my family and two children. I also coach the U13 cricket squads and the time and effort being put in voluntarily by tens of coaches across the age groups is an often unseen but positive part of the Town which is recognised in many parts of the County.

We have been so pleased to see the bar and clubhouse "professionalise" in a safe and welcoming manner during 2021 and 2022. To also see the pitches, clubhouse and surrounding fields being used by the local community and children in an atmosphere of sport and positive outdoor activity - supported by a family oriented clubhouse is just what we have all needed particularly coming out of the mental strain of the COVID years.

The vast majority of families walk to the Rec., have a drink (I have never seen drinking to excess) and return home happy.

The case against the clubhouse reminds me of a professional project I delivered on the Isle of Man. Local residents who moved to a location on the boundary of a quarry offered complaints at the noise from occasional daytime blasting.

On approaching the club no noise is audible from the clubhouse.

The licence application actually offers no longer opening hours than the case now, and in fact could be shorter. The managers of the bar are professional, keep the clubhouse clean and safe and tidy and make those attending comfortable and welcome. The same goes to any visitors entering the clubhouse, and this is in no small part due to the well-mannered way in which the game of cricket is played and how we conduct ourselves at Godalming CC.

The operation of the clubhouse is critical to the standing of the sports being played at, and the clubs who call The Rec. their home.

Dear Sir/Madam,

I understand you are currently receiving submissions from stakeholders regarding the terms of service that dictate who may be served under the Holloway Hill Sports Association (HHSA) Club Premises Certificate. I am a very frequent participant in activities at Holloway Hill – my family and I various play cricket & tennis, use the facilities for exercise, and I coach & umpire both ladies and kids' cricket. I'm often there 4-5 days per week. I believe strongly that the HHSA is critical aspect of the community that exists in the Busbridge and greater Godalming area. One of the greatest delights of living here is seeing groups of people across all age groups; kids, families, teenagers, retirees, out in the park utilising the facilities and attracting social activity around them. Proper, old-fashioned, capital-C community is built through the connections and relationships that are made through many ad-hoc conversations and meetings that happen around such a sports association. At present, I observe a vibrant atmosphere at the HHSA only occasionally – any action that promotes broader utilisation of the facilities in a friendly, inclusive environment is most welcome. We play tennis & my husband organises regular informal weekend hockey practice for a group of Busbridge under-elevens at the Rec, to supplement their attendance at Guildford Hockey Club. Our son is a member of the Godalming cricket team too, playing his first match this summer.

The network of local families we have built as a result of using the Pavilion as a social hub, has been invaluable to us. Gatherings at the Pavilion ensure our children are safe and supervised by numerous sets of responsible, professional parents who they know well, at all times. The Pavilion has built a culture of exercise-as-social-event, which is of obvious benefit to us and our children, building healthy habits for the next generation too.

We seldom use the car-park – all the families we know who visit the Pavilion live a short walk away. The main regular users of the car-park seem to be early morning personal trainers & their clients – and their impact on local traffic levels is negligible.

As a general rule, the Pavilion tends to be empty by 9:00 to 9:30pm at the latest on Friday evenings (cricket night). We all have our children with us and need to get them off to bed.
