Annexe 1 – Mandatory Conditions

Alcohol

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:

- At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
- At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

- **1.** (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available. *
- 3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."
- **5**. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- **6.** For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 5—
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (a) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where-

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 7. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 6 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 6 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

ELEMENTS OF OPERATING SCHEDULE TO ADDRESS LICENSING OBJECTIVES:

a) General - all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e)

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Signage/"Drink Aware" signage, age verification procedures/CCTV signage shall be on display. There shall be no late opening.

All staff shall be trained in health and safety and alcohol awareness.

Conditions agreed with Surrey Police

- Digital CCTV equipment shall be installed and maintained at the premises to record colour images that are clear enough to allow the Police to use them to investigate any crimes that are committed on the premises. The areas covered by the cameras shall cover the main entrance area and all areas and within the premises that are open to the public. A camera shall be positioned to obtain images of persons entering the building by the main entrance.
- 2. The CCTV system shall be in operation and recording at all times.
- 3. Recordings made on the CCTV system shall be retained for a period of at least 30 days of recording.
- 4. If the Police are called to the premises to deal with an incident then the officers shall have access to view the CCTV footage on request. There must be a member of staff on duty at all times who has knowledge of how the CCTV system works. If the CCTV footage cannot be downloaded for the Police when requested then it must be available within 24 hours of the request.
- 5. All staff shall receive suitable training including refresher training every 6 months in relation to challenge 25 proof of age policy which shall be applied to the premises.
- 6. All training shall be recorded and then signed by the person completing the training. The DPS or a personal licence holder who is employed at the premises must also countersign the training record.

c) Public Safety

CCTV signage shall be displayed.

Adequate lighting and fire exit signage shall be provided.

A first aid kit shall be provided under the bar.

There shall be first aid trained staff on the premises.

Conditions agreed with Surrey Police

- 1. The staff shall not sell alcoholic beverages under any circumstances to any person who appears to be intoxicated or under the influence of drugs.
- 2. Any person found using, carrying or supplying controlled substances whilst at the premises staff shall be immediately call the Police.

- 3. No visitor shall be allowed into the brewery unaccompanied.
- 4. A first aid kit shall be kept at the premises.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

The Premises Licence Holder shall monitor noise levels and there shall be signage provided. Staff shall be trained not to serve someone who is inebriated.

Staff shall refuse to serve somebody someone showing a change in behaviour.

Conditions agreed with Surrey Police

- 1. Signage shall be displayed in the courtyard/car park requesting customers to quietly leave the premises and car park.
- 2. No deliveries to be undertaken outside permitted hours.

e) The protection of children from harm

There shall be age verification checks in place.

All alcohol and related sales shall take place "face to face".

All children shall be accompanied by an adult at all times whilst on the premises.

Conditions agreed with Surrey Police

- 1. All staff shall receive suitable training including refresher training in relation to "Challenge 25" proof of age policy which shall be applied to the premises.
- 2. A refusal and incident book shall be kept on the premises all refusals and incidents must be recorded with the day and time and then signed by the person making the entry and then countersigned by the DPS.
- 3. All persons under 18 years of age must be accompanied by an adult.
- 4. Any person attempting to buy alcohol who appears to look under 25 shall be challenged and asked for identification to prove that they are over 18.
- 5. All deliveries shall be signed for and vetted.
- 6. Internet orders shall be signed for and vetted.
- 7. The premises licence holder shall ensure no orders are delivered without the strict policy of proof of age being undertaken .
- 8. The premises licence holder shall ensure that no alcohol is sold to a person under the age of 18.
