1. Licensing Fees Update

The Council has reviewed its fees charged for hackney carriage and private hire licences. The proposed vehicle and operator licence fees were duly advertised in the Surrey Advertiser on Friday 29th March 2024 and the Herald on Thursday 28th March 2024 as well as on the Waverley Borough Council website.

Objections to the scale of fees could be made until midnight on the 26th April 2024. In accordance with legislation and as no objections were received, the new scale of fees came into operation on 30 May 2024.

2. Pavement Licence Policy amendments



The Policy was first introduced in 2020 when the Government introduced new temporary powers to Borough and District Councils to issue these licences to reduce the impact of Covid on businesses, by the Business and Planning Act 2020.

The Government has now extended these powers making them permanent from 31 March 2024 under the Levelling Up and Regeneration Act 2023 and has introduced some minor changes.

- a £500 cap for new applications and a £350 cap for renewal (rather than the original £100 set out in the Business and Planning Act)
- local authorities may grant licences for a length of their choosing (up to two years) and are encouraged to grant licences for two years as standard.
- the 7-day consultation and 7-day determination periods provided for under the temporary regime have been extended to 14 days for each (excluding public holidays).
- clarifies that a minimum width of 2000 mm clear space should be provided between an obstacle and the edge of the footway.
 However, if this is not feasible due to physical constraints, then a minimum width of 1500 mm could be regarded as the minimum acceptable distance.
- existing licence holders can retain their licences granted under the temporary regime until the expiration date on their licence.
- the new pavement licensing provisions grants local authorities' new enforcement powers. From the commencement date, local authorities can, with the consent of the licence-holder, amend the licence in certain circumstances.

- the Act also amends the Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 to include pavement licences within the exemption from public space protection orders.
- no pavement licences can now be granted under the Highways Act 1980 (by Surrey County Council)
- the legislation applies to England only.

Richard Homewood as Joint Assistant Director of Regulatory Services has made these amendments to the policy using his delegated powers following consultation with the Portfolio holder and Chair & Vice of Licensing Committee as part of the process. The level of fee that Waverley will charge has been set at the maximum of £500 for a new licence and £300 for a renewal. It is important to recognise that the new licences are for two years rather than the previous 1 year licence and it is considered that these fee levels represent the cost of the work involved in processing and managing the licence over that period.

REVIEW OF STATEMENT OF GAMBLING POLICY 2025-TIMETABLE

The Gambling Act 2005 requires Waverley to have a Statement of Gambling Policy, that it keeps this under review, and that it must completely review the Policy within every three year period. The current Waverley Policy sets out how we administer the legislation and has been in place since January 2022, and has to be reviewed over the next few months. This will lead up to a new Policy being in place by January 2025 for a maximum three-year period.

4. Hackney Carriage/Private Hire Policy Review

Officers are currently reviewing the Hackney Carriage/Private Hire Policy. The proposed amendments and areas for consideration are highlighted in colour in the attached working draft copy attached.

In particular I would like to mention that there has been some ambiguity regarding the definition of ULEV (ultra-low emission vehicle). Officers are seeking to address and clarify this within the new policy. Officers are also canvassing licensed drivers regarding their opinions and to seek feedback on potential dates for the introduction of an electric only vehicles policy.

5. Fares

Officers have updated the figures on the 27 March 2025 within the Guildford Methodology matrix for Hackney Carriage Fares and it has shown a slight decrease. Officers not minded to consult/amend the fares this year.
