

Dear sir / madam,

I just learned there has been a technical issue preventing representations and write now to ensure my objections are received. I sincerely hope my representation is taken into consideration.

My concerns / objections are:

- The Petrol Station want to sell alcohol during the night only. This will undoubtedly attract more drivers, hence more noise from people shouting, loud car music, revving engines and idling cars). The disorder and public nuisance while local residents are sleeping will be very disruptive to quality of sleep.
- There is an increasing number of cars and vans parking on Old Elstead Road during the day and evening while they visit the Petrol shop. There is no reason doubt the ame will happen when late night drinkers want to use the shop bringing extra noise, and safety fears for local residents.
- Regarding the 24 hour opening licence I object on the basis that significant increase in footfall (from cars and pedestrians) during the night since the shop location moved and the store size tripled has led to more disturbances to the local residents in terms of noise from shouting through the night hatch, horns being used in frustration when the night shift aren't there, and loud music from "party cars" on their way back home. It's a significant difference to how the previous shop was used.

I struggle to understand if there is a genuine demand for alcohol sales during the night, and even that there is demand for 24 hour opening from a commercial perspective. I can only assume that this license application is made to get more business overnight. Not great news for local residents quality of life, which will decline.
